

# Day 1

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## *Are You a Part of the Kingdom Culture*

Christianity never was and never will be a religion. It always was and always will be a culture – the culture of the Kingdom of Heaven. Please read on and I'll explain.

Matthew 4:17 says, “*From that time Jesus began to preach and say, ‘Repent [change your inner self—your old way of thinking, regret past sins, live your life in a way that proves repentance; seek God’s purpose for your life], for the kingdom of heaven is at hand’*” (AMP).

This was at the very beginning of Jesus’ ministry. The first word Jesus preached was the word *repent*. Repent doesn’t mean remorse. It means to transform your thought processes, to change your mind, to think differently. We can’t think the way the world thinks and wonder why things don’t change in our lives. We have to think the way God thinks.

Notice, He never said, “Think differently; you’re a sinner going to hell.” He said, “Think differently, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand.” The word *kingdom* comes from two words: king and domain. Heaven is a domain with a king. In America, we vote every four years for who we want to be president. But that doesn’t happen in the Kingdom of God. We don’t vote for Jesus; He’s the King whether we vote for Him or not.

Sometimes, we make the mistake of reading the Bible, an eastern book, with a western mind. When we do, we can miss an obvious fact – the Bible is a book about kingdoms.

When we were born again, we became a part of the Body of Christ. We were removed from the kingdom of darkness, and transferred into the Kingdom of God's dear Son, the Kingdom of Heaven. Colossians 1:13 says, "*For He has rescued us and has drawn us to Himself from the dominion of darkness, and has transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son*" (AMP).

Even though we've changed kingdoms, many Christians are still operating in the ways of their old kingdom. They are still thinking the old way even though they've joined another kingdom. They are still doing things the old way and waiting for different results. You and I are no longer a part of the kingdom of darkness! We need to adjust our thinking and our ways to the new kingdom.

One translation of Matthew 4:17 says, "*Think differently for the rule or the government of God is beginning now.*" Christianity was never meant to be a religion – it was meant to be the extension and expansion of a kingdom. God wants to use us as His vessels to manifest the Kingdom of Heaven on earth. Too many Christians are trying to get to heaven when we haven't fulfilled our mandate on the earth. We're not here biding time – we're here to change our world by expanding *our* kingdom and its culture!

## Day 2

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### *Kingdom Principles*

The Bible says, “*The government (of the kingdom) shall be upon His shoulders*” (Isaiah 9:6). That means, when Jesus came, He wasn’t bringing a new philosophy or set of ideals. He came to establish an everlasting kingdom with a far superior set of governing principles that bring life and liberty into our spirits. If we are going to be successful and effective, we need to understand and operate in those principles.

Think about this: if you were an ambassador to a foreign land, you would carry with you the laws and principles of your home country. If, instead, you decided to live like those in the foreign land, you would cease to be an effective ambassador. An ambassador is charged with representing the country and the ruler from which he came. The same is true for us; we are ambassadors of Christ. Therefore, we have to learn, and live, in our kingdom’s principles.

We also need to remember that when we are living in our kingdom’s principles, we are no longer attached to the economy of this world – we’re attached to the economy of *our* kingdom. The things that befall the natural economy of the country where we live need not have any bearing on us. After all, heaven doesn’t have any recessions or depressions – God is doing fine in heaven.

You might be saying, “That’s nice for God, but I’m not doing fine down here.” Well, whose kingdom are you living in? If we are living in God’s kingdom, we can enjoy our kingdom’s

benefits. You might be thinking, “How does the economy of our kingdom work?” Jesus answered that when He said, “*Give, and it will be given to you: good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over will be put into your bosom. For with the same measure that you use, it will be measured back to you*” (Luke 6:38). That means our kingdom’s economy operates on entirely different principles – it operates on our *giving*! Jesus also said in Matthew 6:33, “*But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.*” We can reap the benefits of our kingdom when we put His kingdom first and let Him direct our giving.

I challenge you to *try* it. Malachi 3:10 says, “*‘Bring all the tithes (and offerings) into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house, and try Me now in this,’ says the Lord of hosts, ‘If I will not open for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you such blessing that there will not be room enough to receive it.’*” When you give, do so in the measure you want God to bless you. Then release your faith by thanking God for your harvest, and finally, enter His rest. If you do this, you will be operating in a *kingdom principle*, and you will see His benefits come to you as a multiplied harvest!

## Day 3

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### *Life After Debt*

Debt is never your friend – it's always an enemy. For the average believer, consumer debt is a trap to be avoided at all cost. Behind the shiny metal or slick promotion is a giant waiting to enslave you and force you to give up your time and money to satisfy its never-ending hunger for more. The only thing the growing giant gives in return is anxiety, sleepless nights and a host of other painful propositions.

The devil is the master of offering you everything you want *now* – just use that little plastic thing in your pocket and all your needs will immediately be met – and there's no faith required. He used the same trick on Eve in the garden and he's been using it on God's people ever since. He says, "You can have it all. God's the one holding things back. You deserve it *and* you deserve it today!" But the reality for her and us is much different.

The Bible says that through faith and patience we inherit the promises (Hebrews 6:12). And that "*an inheritance hastily gotten [by greedy, unjust means] at the beginning, in the end it will not be blessed*" (Proverbs 20:21 AMPC). It's always better to do it God's way because in the process we will learn the skills necessary to grow and sustain the increase God brings. It's so sad to say that Eve, and her husband Adam, already had everything they needed and more. After all, they were in the Garden of Eden, or the Garden of God's presence. Unfortunately, they followed their flesh and fell, and mankind has suffered

ever since.

My friend, if you have a problem with debt, I want you to know there truly is *life after debt*. God will help you escape debt's grip and enter into the glorious liberty of the Lord. But you will have to make a serious decision to free yourself from debt's tantalizing hold. James 4:4 states, "*Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.*" First John 2:15 says, "*Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.*"

The first step to financial freedom is to love God more than things and the world. Jesus said, "*But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you*" (Matthew 6:33). The second step is to, "*Honor the Lord with your possessions, and with the firstfruits of all your increase*" (Proverbs 3:9). That means faithfully bringing our tithes and offerings to the Lord.

The final simple step is to see yourself free from debt. *What you see you will always move toward*. By following these steps, order will come to your finances, your priorities will align with His, and God's blessing will find a place to rest upon.

## Day 4

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### *How to Know the Voice of God*

Have you ever felt like you were drifting and not really sure what God wanted you to do? Do you lack the confidence you know you should have in your relationship with God? Have you ever found yourself at a point in life where you were confused and not sure which way to go? If you're like most Christians, you probably answered "yes" to at least one of those questions. Well, I want to tell that it doesn't have to be that way!

If you are a child of God, it is your *right* to hear from Him. He wants you to clearly hear His voice and follow His plan for your life. Know this, the devil is the author of confusion, and he would love to make you feel confused for your entire life. And, if you don't do something about it, he will. The good news is that God is on your side, and wants you to hear His voice even more than you want to hear it!


Jesus said three times in John 10 that His sheep know His voice, and they follow the Good Shepherd (John 10:3-4, 16). So, how do we hear His voice? How do we distinguish His voice from all the other voices out there? The answer might surprise you because it is so simple. It may also surprise you to learn that His voice can be very recognizable and clear. Read on, and I'll tell you how it works.

First, we have to recognize that we are a three part being, created in the image and likeness of God (Genesis 1:26). We are a spirit, we have a soul, and we live in a body

(1 Thessalonians 5:23). Your body is not the real you: it's only the earth suit you live in while you are here on earth. Your soul is your mind, will, intellect, and emotions. But that's not the real you either; the *real* you is deep inside. You are a spirit, born from and of the Holy Spirit. And it is the Holy Spirit within our spirit that is our direct link to heaven. This combination is our connection to the throne room of God. This is how God talks to us, and it should be the primary way we communicate with Him – spirit to Spirit.

You should not expect to hear God in your mind. Don't expect to somehow *feel* the leading of the Lord. God designed us to hear Him in our spirit, and that means we need to become more spirit conscious. In fact, we will never experience hearing the voice of God and discovering the perfect will of God in our lives unless we become more conscious of our spirit and the Holy Spirit within us.

Throughout today, remind yourself of who you are by saying, "I am a spirit. I have a soul – my mind, will, and emotions. And I live in a body. I am created in the image and likeness of God...."

# Day 5

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## *The Inward Witness*

The number one way God communicates with our spirit is through the *inward witness*. You might be asking, “What is the inward witness?” I’ll answer that by asking you a question: Do you remember when you were born again? At that moment, how did you know you had been changed? How did you know that the Lord became your Savior? The Book of Romans reveals how you knew. Romans 8:16 says, “*The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God.*” We recognized we were born again because the Holy Spirit bore witness to that spiritual fact in our spirit. In other words, He communicated with us through the inward witness. If that’s the first way God spoke to us, then it’s logical that He would continue to communicate with us in the same way.

The inward witness is the primary way God speaks to us, though not the only way. There are, in fact, several other ways He communicates with us. The second most common way is through the *still small voice* of our spirit. You know, our mind has a voice, and with it we formulate thoughts and then express them. Your body also has a voice. If you have ever stubbed your toe in the middle of the night, you probably heard the voice of your body. In the same way, our spirit has a voice. And, because the Holy Spirit lives in our spirit, the still small voice of our spirit becomes a safe guide in life (John 14:16-17).

You’re probably asking, “How can I be sure I am hearing the voice of my spirit?” I’ll give you three simple answers:

1. Feed your spirit with a steady diet of God's Word by reading from the New Testament, and especially the Epistles – the letters to the churches – every day.
2. Pray in other tongues as often as you can. By doing so, you will build up and strengthen your spirit (1 Corinthians 14:2, 4). Your spirit takes control when you pray in other tongues. If you don't speak in other tongues, then ask the Lord to fill you with His Holy Spirit.
3. Ask the Lord if you should fast something in your life. Remember: fasting doesn't move God, but it subordinates your flesh and mind so your spirit can dominate.

Today, it's so important for us to be able to hear and obey the voice of God in every area of our lives. One area in which it is vital to hearing God's voice is in the area of finances. God is always looking for ways to bring financial provisions and blessings into our lives. However, if we haven't heard His voice and are not giving as He directs, He cannot bring the blessing in the degree He wants to. Make the decision today to hear His voice and follow His leading in every area of your life. Then you will enjoy His provision and His presence today and forever!

## Day 6

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### *Hear and Obey*


Today, the Church desperately needs to learn how to *hear* and *obey* the voice of God. We all need to get to the place where we consistently hear and obey His voice. The experience of failure is not of God, yet it is an all too common human experience. Nevertheless, when we learn how to hear and obey, failures can become distant memories, and success in God can become a normal way of life.

Romans 8:14 says, “*For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God.*” Since the New Testament was written in the Greek language, it’s best to look at the original language to understand the true meaning of the verse. In this case, the word “sons” is a very interesting word. It denotes maturity of character and experience. If we were to read the verse using that definition we could say, “The mature sons of God are the ones who are consistently led by the Spirit of God.” Conversely, we could say that Christians who are not consistently led by God’s Spirit are *immature* believers. Ouch! I hope that didn’t hurt too much. But it is very important to examine yourself. Are you walking in the light of this truth? Are you consistently led by the Spirit of God? If you want to grow in the Lord, you have to hear and obey the voice of God.

The story of Adam and Eve is a timeless example of what happens when God’s people do not listen and obey His voice. The same thing that caused Adam and Eve to disobey God, and walk out of His plan and provision can cause us to

miss out too. The sad story is that Adam and Eve succumbed to the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life instead of the Word of God (Genesis 3:1-6, 1 John 2:15-17). As a result, they lost it all, and God's creation has suffered ever since.

Romans 8:19 says, "*For [even the whole] creation (all nature) waits expectantly and longs earnestly for God's sons to be made known [waits for the revealing, the disclosing of their sonship]*" (AMPC). Notice this verse says, "*God's sons.*" This is the same Greek word used in Romans 8:14. This verse means that all of creation is waiting for God's children to mature, to grow up, and to become the sons He desires – ones who will hear and obey His voice on a continual basis. That means that the universe needs you to grow up and take your rightful position in His family – all creation is simply waiting for *you* to hear and obey the voice of God!

# Day 7

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## *Your Number One Enemy*

Did you know creation was designed to respond to you? Think about it; God originally gave Adam complete dominion over all the earth. The earth and everything in it was designed to respond to Adam, and to *you*. But creation is waiting for you to mature. Creation is longing for you to be led by the Spirit of God (Romans 8:19-22).


What is it that's holding you back from maturing and taking your rightful place in God's creation? The answer is your flesh. Your flesh is your number one enemy and your greatest hindrance. Satan knew that about Adam and Eve and he used their flesh and ignorance against them, and creation has been suffering ever since. Well, the secret is out! You don't have to be ignorant of the devil's weapons anymore! (2 Corinthians 2:11) You don't have to obey your flesh anymore (Ephesians 2:3).

So how do we mature and overcome our number one enemy? It is important to recognize that until you can control your flesh, you are going to have a problem with being led by the Spirit of God consistently – and, therefore, maturing as a son of God. With that in mind, there are some important things you need to remember. First, you are a spirit, you have a soul, and you live in a body. The nature of your body or flesh will always be bent toward sin because sin is the nature of your flesh. But, thank God, you are not your flesh, you just live inside your flesh – you are a spirit, and God's Spirit lives

within your spirit.

Your spirit is your key to overcoming your flesh. Galatians 5:16 says, “*Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh.*” When you allow your spirit to dominate, you will always be on the winning side. It is sad but true; many Christians go through life allowing their flesh to dominate and never become aware of their spirit. It is imperative that we become more spirit-conscious.

So, how do we become more spirit-conscious? How do we allow our spirits to dominate our lives? Jesus said when tempted by the devil, “*It has been written, man shall not live and be upheld and sustained by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God*” (Matthew 4:4 AMPC). Jesus was talking about spiritual food for our spirits. From another perspective, He was saying, “Your spirit is upheld and sustained by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.” Our Bible contains the very food our spirit needs to be upheld, sustained, and strengthened to overcome our flesh. Take every opportunity to read and feed on God’s Word, especially the New Testament. Read it out loud to yourself so you hear it over and over again. Then your spirit will become strong and you’ll be able to overcome your flesh and resist the devil’s temptations!

## Day 8

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### *Your Mind – the Final Battleground*

Our Savior has disarmed the principalities and powers, and made a grand display of their defeat. He conquered the devil, who *had* the power of death. Jesus dealt a death blow to the grave through His resurrection! He brought us into the Father's presence and gave us the gift of eternal life. The war for all ages and eternity has been won through the cross! And all the glory belongs to Him! Yet... there is one place where the battle still rages, one area of vulnerability where your victory or defeat has not been decided, and one place where the final battle has yet to be won – *your mind, the final battleground.*

This battleground, not located in some distant and foreign land, is instead much closer and more personal than we may realize. This battle is so personal it involves the very thoughts we think, entertain, and act on. The Bible says, "*For as he (or she) thinks in his heart, so is he*" (Proverbs 23:7). Because our thoughts are the essence of who we become, it is very important that you and I know how to *win* on this final battleground.

First, we need to recognize that we are not responsible for every thought that comes, *but we are responsible for every thought that stays.* It's vital for us to identify the source of the thoughts we allow in. Remember, the devil tempted Jesus in the thought realm. The same was true for Adam and Eve. Thoughts can come from the devil, as well as many other sources, including God. So we first have to identify the source of those thoughts.

You might be asking, “How can I identify thoughts that come from God?” According to 2 Corinthians 10:3-5, we should compare our thoughts with the Word of God. If a thought doesn’t line up with what the Bible says about God, or us as His children, we should refuse it. In Philippians 4:8, God gives us a checklist to compare our thoughts to: “*Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honorable, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things*” (ASV). Do your thoughts qualify? If they don’t, you shouldn’t be discouraged – it takes time to change.

The Bible takes this principle of guarding our thoughts a step further in Joshua 1:8: “*This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.*” This verse reveals that we should act preemptively by meditating on God’s Word and training ourselves to *think* His words. When we do, according to this verse, we will make our way prosperous and have good success.

## Day 9

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### *The Law of Thoughts*

*“This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success” (Joshua 1:8 AMPC).*

This Scripture reveals what I describe as “the law of thoughts.” By applying the law of thoughts in the right way through meditating on God’s Word continually, we can make our way prosperous and have greater success in our life! This Old Testament verse implies that God has done everything He can to help us succeed in life and that the rest is up to us. The New Testament confirms this principle in 3 John 2 which says, *“Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers.”* It’s up to us to see to it that our soul (mind, will and emotions) prospers. When we think correctly, our lives will begin moving in the right direction.

On this battlefield of the mind, however, we have a foe who fights with the only weapon he has left – *the power of suggestion*. He endeavors to use the law of thoughts against us. Through the power of suggestion, he tries to get us to use our most powerful weapon, not against him, but against ourselves. He knows that if he can get us to accept one of his negative suggestions, then we will *think it, believe it, say it, and then become it*.

The devil has been using this tactic against God's people for millennia. He started with Adam and Eve in the Garden when he asked, "*Did God really say that?*" (Genesis 3:1 NLT)

Today, the devil can't put sickness, disease, or poverty on us, but he can suggest or feed us thoughts about those things. Satan's suggestions, however powerful they may seem, don't have any power over us until we give it to them (1 John 3:8).

According to 2 Corinthians 10:3-5, when we continue to entertain his suggestions and thoughts, they will grow and produce a harvest by becoming imaginations and, eventually, controlling strongholds in our minds. Those thoughts will become words, and then those words will begin to create that reality in our lives. But there is good news! According to that same Scripture, the weapons of our warfare are *mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds!*

Look, we've all been deceived into accepting a thought from the enemy. But that doesn't have to happen anymore! The Apostle Paul said, "...*We are not ignorant of his devices*" (2 Corinthians 2:11). When we know what the Word of God says and how our enemy operates, we can be on guard against his thoughts and suggestions. Of course, the way to *always* win is to begin thinking and speaking the Word of God; then your way will become prosperous and you will enjoy godly success!

# Day 10

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## *Inviting God*

Did you know that God must be invited to *legally* manifest on the earth? Most Christians are confused about this truth, and because they don't understand it, they go through life experiencing disappointments, defeat and lack. Are you giving God the right to move and manifest in your life?


Some might say, "But God can do anything He wants." Yes, that is true. He is all powerful and all knowing, and He is the embodiment of all authority and power in His created universe. We can agree that God is sovereign; however, God in His sovereignty gave the authority over the earth to mankind – to Adam and Eve.

We can see this clearly in the first chapter of Genesis. Genesis 1:26 says, "*God said, Let Us [Father, Son, and Holy Spirit] make mankind in Our image, after Our likeness, and let them have complete authority over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, the [tame] beasts, and over all of the earth, and over everything that creeps upon the earth*" (AMPC). Notice, God gave man-kind *complete authority* over the earth. The Hebrew word means *to have dominion over*, or *to rule or reign over*. This was God's intention for mankind from the very beginning. However, through Adam's disobedience, that authority was given to the devil (Genesis 3). Satan then became the god of this world (2 Corinthians 4:4) with God, in one sense, on the outside of His creation looking in and desiring to redeem and bless mankind.

When Jesus finally returns and Satan's lease runs out, God will once again have complete authority over the earth (Revelation 11:15, 12:12). So, what does that mean for us? Through the death, burial and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit now lives inside of every believer, and through us God influences the world. In other words, we have become His point of access into the earth.

With the Holy Spirit as our connection to heaven, we receive instruction and provision as the results of prayer (John 16:13). When we pray and obey, God's will is established in the earth (Matthew 6:10). When we pray, it gives God legal entry into the situations and circumstances we face. And, when we pray correctly, God can intervene on our behalf.

Some people think that if God doesn't intervene it's because He doesn't want to, or that He doesn't care. But that's not accurate. The truth is, God doesn't intervene because He can't intervene. We must give Him the legal right to help us. That's why it's so important for us to understand *how* to pray and *what* to pray – and when we do, we can pray effectively and God will *always* answer!

# Day 11

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## *Answered Prayer*

Did you know the two most common prayers that Christians pray today are not scriptural and God never hears them? The Bible says if we pray and ask according to His will, He will hear us and grant our request (1 John 5:14-15). That means that if our prayer is not in line with God's will, which is revealed in His Word, then He will not hear that prayer. That's a strong statement, but it is true – God doesn't hear our prayers unless they are according to His will.

Some Christians think God's response to their prayers is either "Yes," "No," or "Maybe." But the Bible says, *"For all the promises of God in Him are Yes, and in Him Amen, to the glory of God through us"* (2 Corinthians 1:20). God's answer to our prayers, based on His will, is always *yes!*


So, what are the two prayers Christians pray and that are not heard, or answered by God?

The first prayer is, "Lord, bless me." You might be thinking, "That sounds scriptural to me." However, the Bible says, *"God, having raised up his Son, sent Him to bless you as you turn, one by one, from your evil ways"* (Acts 3:26, MSG). Another verse says, *"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ"* (Ephesians 1:3). God has already blessed us in Christ! Don't ask Him to bless you again. He did it all two thousand years ago! Jesus said, *"It is finished"* (John 19:30). Jesus isn't fixing up or making

adjustments to any part of our salvation. He did it all – God’s part is finished; it’s on our end that the blessing is being held back.

The second most common unscriptural prayer that Christians pray is, “God, please heal me.” God doesn’t hear this prayer either. So, why is it unscriptural? For the same reason asking God to bless you is unscriptural – He’s already done it! First Peter 2:24 says, “*By His wounds you have been healed*” (AMPC). It is finished! Jesus is seated at the right hand of God because He is finished. God the Father is seated because He’s finished too. His part in our healing was completed 2000 years ago and your healing is ready and waiting on you!

This is also true when it comes to the salvation of the world. God loves the world and that’s why He sent Jesus. The nearly six billion unsaved people in the world do not need God to do any more than He has already done. Jesus already took every sin from every man, woman and child. We will not see multitudes come to the Lord until our part is finished – we have to do something in order for them to receive salvation and join us in heaven. What are you going to do today?

## Day 12

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### *The Flawless Prayer*

First John 5:14-15 says, “*Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we have asked of Him.*”

God’s will is revealed in His Word. According to this verse, when we ask according to God’s will, He hears us. This also means that He doesn’t hear our prayer if we do not ask according to His will. Getting God to hear our prayers then becomes the biggest obstacle we will ever face concerning our prayer life. The exciting news is this – when God *does* hear our prayer, His answer is *always* yes and amen! (2 Corinthians 1:20)

If we could *always* pray according to His will, then He would *always* hear us and we would be praying flawlessly. Easier said than done, right?

Someone might ask, “If that’s the key, how can I constantly know the will of God?” The answer is simple. In our minds we can’t; however, in our spirits we can. Remember from yesterday, we pointed out that the Holy Spirit is our connection to heaven and He lives inside of us.

If we are filled with the Holy Spirit and pray in other tongues, then we can pray flawlessly. When we pray in other tongues, we are *always* praying according to the will of God. When we pray in other tongues, our words are being directed by

the Holy Spirit, and our minds are not involved. When our words are directed by the Holy Spirit, God will watch over the words and perform them because they are *His* words (Jeremiah 1:12). Therefore, the ultimate *flawless prayer* is praying in other tongues.

How much do you pray in other tongues? Are you giving God the legal right to move in every area of your life, or, can He only move in a few areas? Romans 8:26-28 says:

*Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He makes intercession for the saints according to the will of God. And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose.*

The Holy Spirit knows exactly what you need, what your family needs, what the world around you needs, and He wants to pray the flawless prayer through you. Yield yourself to Him today!

## Day 13

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### *Have You Lost Your Hope*

Have you lost your hope? That's a strange question to ask Bible-believing people. However, I think many Christians have never found real Bible *hope* or understood how to use it.

First Corinthians 13:13 says, "*And so faith, hope, love abide....*" Faith, hope, and love are the *three most powerful forces* in the universe. In this verse God elevates hope to the same level as faith and love. Actually, hope is the foundation for faith and love; and without hope, faith and love cannot operate.

God is a Creator and He made man to be a creator too. So, how does He create and how is that related to hope? Keep reading and I'll explain. We know from the creation story in the Book of Genesis that God *conceived*, *believed*, and then *spoke*. Before He created anything, God conceived it. To conceive something is to create a mental image of what is to be formed. In that sense the word *conceive* and *hope* are interchangeable.


How do we create? The same way God did – conceive, believe, and speak. After all, we are created in His image and in His likeness (Genesis 1:26). The work of hope begins with a *thought* as we create a mental image of God's promise being fulfilled in our lives. If we hold on to that image, it will transform into a *confident expectation* of the fulfillment of that promise. If we don't have a mental image based on His Word, we don't have *the God-kind of hope*.

The God-kind of hope sees the promise of God on the

inside, and eventually faith manifests it on the outside. The Bible says that *faith is the substance of things hoped for* (Hebrews 11:1). Hope, therefore, sets the goal that faith then brings substance to.

Without hope, faith has nothing to which it can attach itself. If you don't have a *confident expectation* of something, there's nothing to which your faith can attach substance. Also, if your mental picture of God's promise changes to what the world says, the greatest faith won't accomplish anything. In other words, hope is like a blueprint, and you cannot continually change the blueprint while the *Builder* is at work bringing substance to the house. How can faith produce anything when the blueprint keeps changing? (James 1:5-8)

This struggle takes place in our minds. Our minds are connected to our flesh – our eyes, ears, and all our senses. Our minds, receiving information from our senses, will naturally focus on negative things. However, our minds are also connected to our spirits. And our spirits are sending the Word of God to our minds. God's Word will continually reinforce the mental picture of God's promise that *hope* has created there. Our faith will always manifest the promise of God's Word as long as we continue to hold fast to "*our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful*" (Hebrews 10:23). What are you going to start creating today?

## Day 14

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### *Hope – Seeing the Unseen*

What are you focusing on in your life? Second Corinthians 4:18 tells us where our focus should be: *“While we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal.”*

When you are operating in the God-kind of hope, you will have to ignore the circumstances and instead focus on the internal picture of God’s promise being fulfilled in your life. According to this verse, we should never live our lives focused on circumstances. Contrary circumstances will always confront us; instead, we must hold on to the vision of His promise being fulfilled in our lives. Hebrews 6:18-19 shows us two things that will help us hold on to the mental picture that hope creates:


*This was so that, by two unchangeable things [His promise and His oath] in which it is impossible for God ever to prove false or deceive us, we who have fled [to Him] for refuge might have mighty indwelling strength and strong encouragement to grasp and hold fast the hope appointed for us and set before [us]. [Now] we have this [hope] as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul [...a hope] that reaches farther and enters into [the very certainty of (His) Presence] (AMPC).*

Through His *promise* and His *oath*, we can have *“mighty indwelling strength and strong encouragement”* to hold on to that mental picture. Remember, a *promise* is an

unchangeable commitment that God has obligated Himself to fulfill. His *oath* is the covenant that He made with us through His Son, Jesus. This hope then becomes an anchor to our soul, or mind, and this anchor reaches all the way into the security of His presence! When we have this kind of hope, we can see through and beyond the storms of life and hold on to the hope until our faith brings substance to His promise!

Romans 15:13 says that, through the power of the Holy Spirit, we can abound and overflow with this hope or confident expectation. People become *hopeless* when they only see with their natural eyes and no longer see the picture of God's promises being fulfilled in their lives. Through ignorance, neglect, or both, many will, unfortunately, live a defeated and disappointing life. But we don't have to live like that anymore! We can use the creative power of hope, and "substance" producing faith, and move higher in God! With God's Word, we can conceive, believe, speak and then *see*!

What are you *hoping* for? What are you creating in your mind with God's Word? What do you want to see manifested in your life this year? Allow hope to create a mental image of that promise being fulfilled. Remember, what you conceive and believe you will receive!

## Day 15

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### *Faith That Cannot Fail, Part 1*

*“Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ” (1 Thessalonians 5:23).*

We, as children of God, have been created as spirit, soul and body. Our spirit is the real us deep inside and is the part of us that was “born again” when we received Jesus as our Savior. Our soul is different; it is our mind, will, intellect and emotion. And our physical body is where we live while we are here on earth.

When we were born again, the Holy Spirit came to live inside us – inside our spirits. When the Holy Spirit speaks, He speaks to our spirit and then our spirit, the real us, communicates with our mind.

For believers to effectively hear their spirit, they need to feed it. Just like our mind and body can be fed, our spirit also can be fed. What is it that makes our spirit stronger? The Word of God. So, in order to hear the voice of God in our spirit clearly, our spirits need to be nourished by God’s Word (Mathew 4:4, 1 Timothy 4:6).


The Bible says, *“So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God”* (Romans 10:17). Notice that hearing God’s Word causes our faith to grow, as well as feeding our spirit. The Word of God is so important to living a faith life and pleasing God! (Hebrews 11:6)

To understand how faith works, it's best to go back to the beginning of our relationship with God through Jesus Christ and see how we were born again. Romans 10:9-10 says, "*That if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.*"

According to this verse, the most amazing miracle the universe has ever known was accomplished through two things – confessing with your mouth that Jesus is your Lord and believing that God raised Him from the dead. Those two actions brought us salvation and an eternity in God's presence! Hallelujah!

Now, I want you to notice something else about these two verses. They say, to "*believe in your heart*" and "*with the heart one believes.*" We can say that faith is of the heart, or that faith is an action of the heart – our heart is where faith is located and operates from!

The Bible states in Colossians 2:6, "*As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him.*" This means that receiving Jesus as our Savior is the beginning of a whole new faith walk, not a one-time faith experience. That's why 2 Corinthians 5:7 says, "*For we walk by faith, not by sight.*" Are you believing in your heart and walking by faith today?

## Day 16

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### *Faith That Cannot Fail, Part 2*

*“So Jesus answered and said to them, ‘Have faith in God. For assuredly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, “Be removed and be cast into the sea,” and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that those things he says will be done, he will have whatever he says. Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them ’” (Mark 11:22-24).*

In this passage Jesus talked about having faith in God, or *the God-kind of faith*. Like we saw yesterday, Jesus referred to “believing in the heart” and “saying with the mouth” in order to move mountains. When we operate in the God-kind of faith – when we *believe* and *speak* – we too can move the mountains we face!

Abraham, the father of faith, used the God-kind of faith also. Romans 4:20-21 says, *“He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strengthened in faith, giving glory to God, and being fully convinced that what He had promised He was also able to perform.”* Abraham never wavered in his heart about God’s promise to him. Instead, he was absolutely convinced God would perform it.

Abraham, by believing God’s promise in his heart and confessing he was *“the father of many nations”* (Genesis 17:4), activated *“the law of faith”* (Romans 3:27). Think about that – every time Abraham said his name, he was calling himself the father of many nations, and he was doing that before he and

Sarah even had a child! When he activated the law of faith, it was like getting into an aircraft. On the ground, we are affected by gravity, but when the aircraft begins to race down the runway, we begin to overcome the law of gravity with the laws of aerodynamics. After a minute or two, we are soaring in the air and gravity has lost its grip. The law of faith does the same for us spiritually! Like Abraham, we can overcome by using God's law of faith.

With this declaration, Abraham also demonstrated another important principle of faith – *faith is past tense*. Faith is not what you are *believing* for; faith is what you have *believed* for. Faith is always past tense; God isn't going to do anything for you He hasn't already finished in Christ. Faith always leaves a mark in time when you believe you receive the promise of God. Without that mark to look back on, we really haven't stepped into the God-kind of faith.

We can recognize this principle in Mark 11:24. Jesus said, *“Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them.”* Notice the “having” came after the believing. You see, you don't have the God-kind of faith unless you can pinpoint the moment you believed you received the promise of God. But when you do, you will have activated the law of faith that cannot fail!

# Day 17

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## *Voice Activated System*

Did you know you live in a *word* created and *word* controlled universe? We know from the book of Genesis that, when God speaks, two things happen. Things are created and things are changed. After God created the earth and mankind in His image, something remarkable happened – He empowered mankind with the first law of the *voice activated system* (Genesis 1:28). This empowerment included the ability to create and change things with words. When God empowered mankind, He also restricted His own authority to what was spoken *through* mankind.

In the Old Testament, for example, He used prophets to speak for Him, but things are different today. *Now He wants to use you!* In Matthew 28:18-19, Jesus gave that authority to the Church, and He wants us to become His mouthpieces in the earth today!

Isaiah 46:10 says, “*Declaring the end and the result from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done, saying, ‘My counsel shall stand, and I will do all My pleasure and purpose.’*” God declares the end and the results from the beginning. The world we live in is still activated by words. So what *end* and *results* are you declaring for your life? Whether you know it or not, your words frame your world. Every word you speak brings either more light or more darkness into your life. Sometimes it’s better for you to say nothing than to say what your senses are saying because

that can open the door to influences from Satan's kingdom.

Jesus stated something very interesting in Matthew 6:31. He said, "*Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?'*" Notice here the connection between *worry* and *speaking*. Did you know God's Kingdom is a *worry-free* kingdom? Worry isn't allowed in it. If we worry, we choke off God's influences in our lives. When you worry, you've taken the responsibility for yourself *onto yourself*. We also understand from this Scripture that our natural tendency is to worry, and then speak those worries. By speaking those worries we empower them to dominate our lives.

Let's take that a little further. What is a worry? A worry usually comes as a negative thought. How did that thought come? It came as a suggestion from the kingdom of darkness. One version of Matthew 6:31 says, "*Take no thought, saying....*" If we *take* that thought, and worry finds a home within us, what will happen next? The thought will turn into words and come out of our mouth. When it does, we have allowed the devil, who has been stripped of all power, to use the voice-activated system against us. On the other hand, God reveals His thoughts in His Word. Instead, we need to "take God's thought, saying," and unleash the power of God's voice activated system in our lives. What are you saying today?

## Day 18

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### *How to Fulfill God's Vision, Part 1*

You're on assignment from heaven! You have a purpose, a plan, a vision, and an assignment from God to fulfill! There is nobody like you in the world, and you have been given a specific gift and the grace to operate in that gift. No one else but you can accomplish the mission and fulfill the vision!

It's strange but true—God doesn't want you in heaven right now. He is waiting for you to fulfill the vision and finish your assignment. Yet today, too many Christians have got their bags packed and are praying to leave. But we're not going to get out of here until we fulfill our assignment, and we've got a whole world to change.

If you and I left now, we wouldn't hear the Master say, *"Well done, good and faithful servant"* (Matthew 25:21). Besides, Jesus prayed to the Father in John 17:15, *"I do not ask that You will take them out of the world, but that You will keep and protect them from the evil one."* So, whose prayer is going to be answered? Your prayer to leave, or His prayer to stay?

In that same prayer, Jesus also said, *"Just as You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world"* (John 17:18). Did Jesus have an assignment? He sure did! Did Jesus fulfill that assignment and fulfill God's vision for His life? Absolutely—and we can too!

Every believer has a purpose, a plan, and a vision from

God. Some Christians may know it very clearly, while others are utterly clueless about God's vision for their lives. Do you know what yours is? Let me show you briefly how to discover it *and* fulfill it.

First, we must keep looking at the Word of God if we want to discover and fulfill God's vision. Jesus, as the Son of Man, discovered God's vision for Himself through the revelation of the Scriptures. In the same way, you'll discover God's vision as you draw closer to Him through His Word. If we don't have a vision, then we won't have a clear destination. The purpose of vision is to give you direction and a destination in life (Proverbs 29:18).

Before you find your vision, you need to find your *purpose*. The first step to finding your purpose is to find your *passion*, because your passion is always connected to your purpose. It's easy to find your passion; ask yourself what you would do to serve God if money were not a problem. When you've answered that question, you will have found your passion. When you've found your passion, you will also find your gifting, because your gifting will always match your passion. After uncovering your passion, you've also discovered your purpose. Your *vision* then becomes the fulfillment of that purpose. How are you going to fulfill God's vision today?

## Day 19

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### *How to Fulfill God's Vision, Part 2*

Habakkuk, the Old Testament prophet, was given instructions about a vision he received from God in Habakkuk 2:2. The passage reads, “*And the Lord answered me and said, ‘Write the vision and engrave it so plainly upon tablets that everyone who passes may [be able to] read [it easily and quickly] as he hastens by’*” (AMPC). In this verse, God revealed to Habakkuk the steps necessary for him to see the manifestation of the vision.

God told him to *write the vision*. Writing the vision makes it specific. Why is it critical that your vision be specific? Because real faith is always specific. Writing it down will also give you a focal point for your life.

Another important reason to write it down is *so that others can read it*. Your vision will never manifest unless people can read it and understand it. Your vision is continuously connected with others because you are part of the Body of Christ. Also, God’s vision for you is always bigger than you, and that’s why you’ll need others to help accomplish it. Always remember this: *Faith was never meant to move people—faith moves mountains. Vision moves people*. Your vision must be inspirational. God’s instruction to Habakkuk in another version reads, “*Write the vision and make it plain on tablets, that he may run who reads it.*” If your vision isn’t inspiring runners, write it again. Vision transfer *must* occur for the vision to manifest. *If your vision doesn’t affect people,*

*people will never assist in your vision.* Vision causes people to focus and move in the same direction.

Habakkuk 2:3 says, “*For the vision is yet for an appointed time and it hastens to the end [fulfillment]; it will not deceive or disappoint. Though it tarry, wait [earnestly] for it, because it will surely come*” (AMPC). A vision is always for an *appointed time*. Vision is what you see in your future. Vision is what you see in your heart, whether your eyes are open or not. This vision, God’s vision for you, will manifest as long as you do your part.

God never gives a vision without first establishing the *provision*. The word *provision* means “for the vision.” The money needed to bring your vision or any vision to pass is hidden in a *seed*; not just any seed—it must be the *right seed*. Within that seed is the power to create the *provision* for your vision. Without the right seed, the power for the vision to manifest will not be there. There are a lot of visions not coming to pass because they lack power—the right seed has *never* been sown. Satan cannot defeat a child of God who has the authority of God’s vision and plants the right seed to produce what is needed to fulfill that vision. Are you letting God direct your giving? Are you sowing the *right seeds* in your life so God’s vision can be fulfilled?

## Day 20

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### *God's Timing For Your Life, Part 1*

Time is an amazing gift our Father has given us. He created *time* for us. This gift of time was given for a purpose, and how we use this gift in our lives is the foundation of who we are and what we are going to do for eternity. The gift of time is priceless to God, and it should be to us.

For God, there has always been a purpose in giving humanity time. God has given each of us time to fulfill a plan. Ephesians 2:10 says, "*We are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.*" There are *good works* that we are supposed to do within the time He has given us. Each good work is connected to a plan. This plan is connected to a path – and all the provision we need is on that path.


Think about this: none of the provision Jesus needed while on earth came from heaven. The provision was already here and waiting for Him. Most Christians are seeking the *provision*, when they should be seeking the *plan and the path*. In order to please God, we need to dedicate ourselves to walking in His plan, and on the path He has for us.

You might be asking, "How do I walk on the path He has for me?" God's Word always has the answer, and in fact, it brings light to our path so we can see it (Psalm 119:105). We also learn in Psalm 102:13, in the Amplified version, that God has "designated moments" for us on our path.

Daniel, in the Old Testament, discovered a designated moment while reading the book of Jeremiah. He recognized God wanted to return the children of Israel to their land after *seventy years* of captivity. What did Daniel do? He didn't do what most Christians do. Most Christians think about how nice it will be when something like that comes to pass. Instead, Daniel got after it and prayed, and the children of Israel walked in their designated moment (Daniel 9:2).

As we read the Bible, we can discover a multitude of designated moments that God set up for His people. But, what about you? Does God have designated moments for you? Are you walking in them? Are you in God's timing for your life?

Until we value God's precious gift of time, we will never reach a "designated moment." Only eternity knows how many designated moments we've missed. You see, it's not just doing the right thing; it is doing the right thing *at the right time*. His *timing* is so important. The Holy Spirit was sent to help you find the timing of God so you can walk in *His* designated moments. When you are on the path, wait for God's timing, and you will have divine connections and open doors.

## Day 21

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### *God's Timing For Your Life, Part 2*

Time can be your friend as well as your enemy.

Procrastination is the thief of designated moments. When one puts off until tomorrow that which should be done today, it is procrastinating. Procrastination allows the devil to steal your gift of time and your designated moments. Whether we like it or not, we all have a limited amount of time. Time will move on with us or without us.

Matthew 16:27 says, *“For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of His Father... and then He will render account and reward every man in accordance with what he has done.”* This describes the day of accounting. We'll all have to answer for what we did with the gift of time God gave us. Will He say to you, “Well done my good and faithful servant?” Or, will He simply say, “Well...?” and wait for your answer.

It is very easy to let our time fly by. However, Ephesians 5:16 says we should make the very most of our time and be about our Father's business (Luke 2:49). Sometimes we are busy *doing*, but not busy doing what we are called to do? You know, if we can make the *very most* of our time, we can also make the *very least* of our time. Time won't make *the most* by itself. We have to do it. Time never becomes productive for God by itself.


A millionaire and a poor man have the same opportunity. The difference is in what they do with their time. It is said that while a rich man *educates* himself, a poor man

*entertains* himself. Wealth is almost always connected to the proper use of time. When we don't value time, it slips away from us... and it never comes back. *Time doesn't wait for anyone.*

Greatness, or influence, is achieved through the force and exercise of self-discipline. Discipline is always needed to maximize our time. God doesn't open opportunities to the *lazy*; He opens opportunities to the *diligent*. And we must prepare for great opportunities, not just wait for them. Opportunities can come suddenly, and if you're prepared, you can take advantage of those opportunities.

The gift of time also comes in seasons. There are seasons to prepare and seasons to fulfill God's plan. There was a time for Jesus to prepare for His ministry, a time to begin His ministry, and a time to fulfill His ministry (Matthew 4:17). The same applies to you and me.

Also, time always brings harvests. A man will always reap what he sows, and time ensures this. Genesis 8:22 says, "*While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, winter and summer, and day and night shall not cease.*" That means that God has designated times of harvest in your life. Will you be ready for them? Have you been sowing the right seeds at the right times to receive your designated harvests?

## Day 22

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### *Grace to Run Your Race, Part 1*

Grace is like having gas in your tank. If your vehicle doesn't have enough fuel to get home, you need to start looking for a gas station. The same is true with the grace of God – if you don't have enough, you'll never finish the race God has for you. So, what is this fuel we need as Christians? What is the grace of God, and how does it work?

Grace comes from the Greek word *charis* and means “freely given through favor,” and “freely given on account of someone else.” This someone else is Jesus! Because of what Jesus did when He went to the cross, God's grace is now available to us. Grace literally means benefits. Unmerited favor is only one of those wonderful benefits. Grace is also power beyond our ability. This grace is a reflection and a result of God's love, and it has nothing to do with us. Grace is a free gift from our Creator, and it can never be earned. All of the promises of God are encompassed by this grace. However, *we have to learn how to receive and release this amazing grace* from God, and most Christians have no idea how to do it.


First, we need to recognize there are many different graces from God, and the reason for them is to fulfill God's purpose. When you have grace, it's because God wants you to do something. Grace is always given for a purpose or task. Whatever God wants you to do, you can't do it by yourself. You can't do it in your own strength. You *must* have God's grace to accomplish His purpose.

When you step into His purpose, grace causes things to work out. Grace is an umbrella that you never want to leave home without. Grace is a place where you want to spend your life. You will find yourself under the umbrella of His grace when you are fulfilling God's purpose for your life.

The Apostle Paul was a wonderful example of someone walking in the fullness of God's grace. He said in 1 Corinthians 15:10, "*By the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me was not in vain (fruitless and without effect); but I labored more abundantly than they all, yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me.*"

The grace that was with and upon Paul was to travel, bring the Gospel throughout the known world, and start churches wherever he went. He knew how to stay under God's umbrella of grace. We could say he knew *his place in grace*.

Do you know your place in His grace? Is God's grace toward you in vain, or will you fulfill God's grand design for your life?

## Day 23

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### *Grace to Run Your Race, Part 2*

The Apostle Paul, inspired by the Holy Spirit, said in Romans 5:1-2, “*Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom also we have access by faith into this grace in which we (firmly and safely) stand.*”

Grace is where we stand, *not fall*. Grace is a place where we can't be moved. Weapons will be formed against us, but if we stay in our place of grace, they won't prosper. Grace will cause us to overcome every trial and every problem. Mountains never move for the movable; they only move for the *immovable* – they move for those who stand in and by the grace of God!

If you study the life of Paul, you realize that God's grace kept him alive and brought him through many severe trials. Paul stood so firmly in grace that he looked forward to being in situations where he was weak, because he knew the grace of God would show up and deliver him (2 Corinthians 12:9-10). We too can trust in this grace.


Romans 5:1-2 also reveals that grace is accessed by faith. That means grace is released through the voice activated system. What you say matters when it comes to grace because grace is released by words.

Always remember, what you *see* is what you *say*. What are you seeing? Proverbs 4:20-21 states, “*My son, give attention to my words; incline your ear to my sayings. Do not*

*let them depart from your eyes; keep them in the midst of your heart.*” The way to change what you say is to change what you see. Are you seeing the Word of God, or the overwhelming circumstances around you? In order to stay under the umbrella of God’s grace, you have to stop looking at your circumstances and trials. Instead, keep God’s Word before your eyes so you will *see* the right thing and therefore *say* the right thing. By doing this, you control the amount of grace released into your life.

The grace God makes available to us through faith is so big. He even gives us grace to be generous givers. Second Corinthians 9:8 says, “*And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work.*” In a previous verse, God encourages believers to abound in the *grace* of giving (2 Corinthians 8:7). Why? Because giving unlocks all grace to abound, or overflow abundantly, toward us.

Is your grace tank filled to overflowing? Are you running on fumes, or do you have *grace to run your race*? Run to God and let Him fill your tank up again!

## Day 24

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### *God's Honor System*

Honor is the place of beginnings with God. When we honor God, His blessings begin. The degree to which we honor God, His Word, and the things of God determines the degree to which He honors and blesses us. This is *God's honor system*.

When we understand God's honor system, we can experience all His blessings, because His blessings flow through it. For example, the commandment to honor your parents comes with a blessing and the promise "*that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth*" (Ephesians 6:3). Why? When we are honoring our parents, we are honoring God and His Word so His blessings begin to flow!

God's honor system, however, goes much deeper. Over time, honor will determine how much you accomplish in your life. Honor will affect your life more than talent, education, background, and your network of friends. Honor is who you are, and every decision you make is a reflection of that honor.

There's a connection between honor and grace. Grace will begin coming after we have chosen, and started to walk, in the pathway of honor. The pathway is God's plan. When we conduct ourselves in honor on that pathway, then grace manifests the blessing.

Remember, God is no respecter of persons; He doesn't pick and choose. He wants to bless, save and heal everyone; yet it is only the ones who chose to honor Him who will receive everything God has for them.

When we decide to bring our tithes and offerings to the Lord in faith, we have chosen to honor Him. Malachi 1:6-7 states:

*The Lord of Heaven's Armies says to the priests: "A son honors his father, and a servant respects his master. If I am your father and master, where are the honor and respect I deserve? You have shown contempt for my name! But you ask, 'How have we ever shown contempt for your name?' You have shown contempt by offering defiled sacrifices on my altar. Then you ask, 'How have we defiled the sacrifices?' You defile them by saying the altar of the Lord deserves no respect" (NLT).*

The priests in the Old Testament were giving God their worst, not their best. By doing so, they chose to dishonor Him. If we don't honor God with our giving, He will not honor us in our finances. This is one reason why so many Christians are struggling financially. The Lord said, *"For those who honor Me I will honor, and those who despise Me shall be lightly esteemed"* (1 Samuel 2:30).

We need to honor God in our giving and in every area of our lives. You see, honor is an outward reflection of the inward condition of the heart. Focus your heart on honoring God in everything you do. Decide today how you are going to honor Him and activate God's honor system in your life?

## Day 25

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### *Wisdom for Business*

Fishing was Simon Peter's business, livelihood, and trade. He was a fisherman and businessman like his father probably was before him. Peter had no reason to believe his day was going to be any different than any other day – some days you catch fish and some days you don't.

*So it was, as the multitude pressed about Him to hear the word of God, that He stood by the Lake of Gennesaret, and saw two boats standing by the lake; but the fishermen had gone from them and were washing their nets. Then He got into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the multitudes from the boat. When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch" (Luke 5:1-4).*

At Jesus' request, Peter's mind began to race. The request was so contrary to everything Peter knew – *you don't catch fish in the daytime*. Peter had to make a choice about whether to follow what *he* knew about fishing or to do what Jesus told him.

*But Simon answered and said to Him, "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless at Your word I will let down the net." And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. So they signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and*

*filled both the boats so that they began to sink* (Luke 5:5-7).

In that moment, Peter turned his business over to the Lord. Then the Lord caused Peter's business to explode *with fish!* No one is more qualified to be a partner in your business than the Creator of heaven and earth. The Lord knew, from a business perspective, exactly where Peter needed to make an investment, then the Lord multiplied the results. Peter's dream of a really big haul became a reality because he was willing to turn his business over to the Lord.

If you make God the Senior Partner in your business like Peter did, then God should have a say in what happens every day. Most business people make decisions based on what they see rather than what the Word of God says or what the Holy Spirit may be saying. If we want a big catch like Peter, then we have to change the way we think; otherwise, we won't change the way we *do* business.

Do you want to be successful in business? You can do it God's way or the world's way. We should never confuse worldly business principles with the truth of God's Word. By applying His truth to our businesses, God can take us "*exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think*" (Ephesians 3:20). That's what He did for Peter and that's what He'll do for you. After all, the Bible is the *ultimate success book*.

## Day 26

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### *The Power of Love*

Love is the greatest superpower in the whole world. It doesn't leap tall buildings in a single bound or do anything like that, but it is absolutely the greatest force the universe has ever known. Why? To begin with, God *is* love. He doesn't have some and occasionally use it whenever someone needs it. No, it is fundamentally Who He is. Wherever He goes, His love is there. Whatever He touches feels it. Whatever He says reveals it, and wherever He looks experiences it. His undeniable, unconditional, and unending love can be discovered by anyone anywhere because God is everywhere.

As Christians, we are caretakers and carriers of this amazing power. The Bible says *"the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us"* (Romans 5:5). When we were born again, we became a new creation in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17). The Lord said through the prophet Ezekiel, when prophesying about our day, *"Then I will give them one heart, and I will put a new spirit within them"* (Ezekiel 11:19). The New Testament says, *"But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with Him"* (1 Corinthians 6:17).

It is wonderful that we can experience His love in our own lives, but that's not where it's supposed to end. He didn't give us the capacity to carry His amazing love just so we can enjoy it. He wants us to bring it to others. He wants His love to explode into the earth, and we are the ones chosen to carry out this holy task.

The Bible says, “*If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself,’ you do well*” (James 2:8). As kings and priests in the earth, sharing God’s love is our *royal* duty (Revelation 1:6). When we represent the King of Kings, as His ambassadors, we have a very important royal role to fulfill. So, how do we do it? Of course, Jesus is our example. He said, “*This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one’s life for his friends*” (John 15:12-13). Examine the Gospels and find out how Jesus loved His disciples and people around Him.

The Holy Spirit used the Apostle Paul to capture Jesus’ attitude and actions with these words from 1 Corinthians 13:4-8:

*Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails. But whether there are prophecies, they will fail; whether there are tongues, they will cease; whether there is knowledge, it will vanish away.*

Are you ready to use your superpower today?

## Day 27

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### *The Authority of the Believer*

The authority of the believer is one of the most misunderstood subjects of the Bible. Many Christians struggle throughout their lives because they don't have any revelation about the authority they *already* possess. God's people never perish for lack of money; they perish instead because they lack knowledge (Hosea 4:6).

The devil has long fought the Church over this revelation. He knows that if we discover our authority in Christ, he's finished. We are no threat to him as long as we live in ignorance. We're only dangerous to him when we realize we are seated with Christ in heavenly places and Jesus has given us authority over him (Ephesians 2:6).

Jesus told His disciples, "*Behold, I give you the authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you*" (Luke 10:19). That would be odd if He were giving his disciples permission to step on the critters in their backyards. No, Jesus was speaking symbolically of the enemy, and He gave them (and us) authority over *all* the power of the enemy.

In Matthew 28:18-19 Jesus said, "*All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore....*" In context, Jesus was saying, "In my authority, go into all the world and make disciples." The Bible here and elsewhere describes this restoration of authority. In the book of Genesis, we learn that Adam lost it through disobedience. But Jesus,

through the cross, and His resurrection, won it back! Then, as members of His body, He gave it to us!

Colossians 2:14-15 says, “*Having wiped out the handwriting of requirements that was against us, which was contrary to us. And He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross. Having disarmed principalities and powers, He made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them in it.*” Jesus stripped the devil of his power and made a public spectacle of him. We can now look down and laugh from our heavenly seat in Christ!

Religious-minded people would caution ignorant believers about the devil. They might say, “Be careful and don’t say anything that might get the devil’s attention. We don’t want to make the devil mad. You never know what might happen.” No! The devil was defeated by Jesus two thousand years ago! He’s now under our feet and we have authority over him!

James 4:7 says, “*Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you.*” What does that sound like to you? Should we be afraid of him? No! After we submit to God, we are supposed to *resist* him. Then what happens? He will flee from you! In the original Greek language, that phrase means “to flee as if in terror.” That means the devil is scared of you when you are submitted to God. That’s the truth from God’s Word,

and the truth will always set you free! (John 8:32)

## Day 28

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### *Our Health Benefits*

Healing is easy – and healing belongs to you! Health and healing are a part of our covenant with God through Jesus. Every Christian should enjoy the benefits of healing. Psalm 103:2-4 says, “*Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits: Who forgives all your iniquities, Who heals all your diseases, Who redeems your life from destruction, Who crowns you with lovingkindness and tender mercies.*” Sometimes Christians forget their benefits, while others have never learned they have them. Most Christians recognize that God *can* heal them, though they’re not quite sure how to get their healing. Is that you? Do you believe God can heal you, and even wants to heal you, but you’re not experiencing healing?

The reality is that we should know how to get healed, how to stay healed, and how to minister healing to others. God really does want to use us to bring salvation and healing to the world, but first we need to receive and walk in healing so we can effectively minister healing to others.

Let’s cover a few basics before we go deeper. First, God loves you and that will never change. He is always good, and He thinks about you every day. He longs for you to enjoy His *presence, provision, and power*. Second, because He never changes, miracles are still possible in your life today – and for those around you. Third, we must always keep in mind that the devil is bad. We should never expect any good to come from compromising with him. Death, disease, and destruction are all

a part of his nature. I like to say, “God is always good, and the devil is always bad.” If we walk in this principle, our theology, or thinking about God, will always be on the right side.

Let’s dig deeper – there are two ways that God heals people: by the gifts of the Spirit *and* through faith. The gifts flow as the Spirit wills (1 Corinthians 12:11). We don’t decide when these gifts operate, the Holy Spirit does. They are used primarily by God to demonstrate His power to sinners so they will accept Jesus. In the healing ministry of Jesus, we see the gifts in operation. However, most of the healings that occurred in His ministry didn’t involve the gifts of the Spirit, but instead depended on the faith of the people needing healing. That means that the responsibility to receive healing belongs to us *and* not God.

Do you remember the woman (Mark 5:25-34) with the issue of blood? Jesus didn’t even know she was in the crowd until she reached out to Him and received her healing. Even then, He asked, “Who touched me?” This story reveals that she came into contact with the anointing, or power, and was healed entirely through her *own* faith. Today, you too can have the same experience and be healed when *your* faith comes into contact with the anointing.

## Day 29

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### *The Healing Twins*

The story of the woman with the issue of blood in Mark 5:25-34 reveals the two elements present and necessary for her healing: *faith* and the *anointing*. I describe faith and the anointing as the *healing twins*, because without both in operation, a person will never be healed.

Do you remember the story of Jesus and the paralyzed man who was lowered through the roof in Luke 5:17-26? The anointing or power was present to heal people, but no one was healed. The house was filled with teachers of the law and Pharisees, but the anointing wasn't released – that is until the paralyzed man and his four faith-filled friends showed up. When their faith met the anointing, the paralyzed man was suddenly healed. My friend, miracles like that are possible today. We just need to understand how the healing twins work – we have to understand the laws of faith and the laws of the anointing. When we do, we can walk in health and bring healing to others.

You might be thinking, “I understand the faith part, but that was Jesus, and I’m not anointed like He was.” Well, that’s not necessarily true. Let’s look at what the Bible says about the anointing and where it comes from.

Acts 10:38 says, “*How God anointed and consecrated Jesus of Nazareth with the [Holy] Spirit and with strength and ability and power; how He went about doing good and, in particular, curing all who were harassed and oppressed by [the power of] the devil, for God was with Him*” (AMPC). Jesus was

anointed with the Holy Spirit and power. So, what about us?  
Are we anointed in the same way?

Acts 1:8 says, “*But you shall receive power (ability, efficiency, and might) when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you shall be My witnesses...*” (AMPC). It sure sounds like we are anointed in the same way! Jesus told the disciples in Mark 16:

*And these attesting signs will accompany those who believe: in My name they will drive out demons... they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will get well. So then the Lord Jesus, after He had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven and He sat down at the right hand of God. And they went out and preached everywhere, while the Lord kept working with them and confirming the message by the attesting signs and miracles that closely accompanied [it]. Amen (so be it) (Vs. 17-20, AMPC).*

The proof is in the fact that the disciples did the very same works that Jesus did when the Holy Spirit came upon them. The only difference between the early disciples and us is that they understood how the healing twins work, and most of us are just starting to figure it out.

What about you? Are you anointed with the power of the Holy Spirit? The Bible says you are! Now be led by the Him and believe its true today!

## Day 30

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### *Discovering the Key to All Success*

Did you know the red letters of your Bible are not the words of Jesus? The red letters in your Bible are the words of the Father speaking. According to the Bible (John 8:28), Jesus did not speak or do anything on His own; instead He spoke and did only what He heard the Father speak. That's why the supernatural followed Him everywhere He went, and that's why He was always successful. In the same way, the Holy Spirit was sent to help us hear and do what the Father speaks.

When we constantly follow the Holy Spirit, we will constantly have success—obedience is the key to all success! So, how can we always hear and obey the voice of the Father with the help of the Holy Spirit?


First, you must remember that the more Word of God you know, the easier it is to hear and obey. When you know the Word, it's really easy to follow the Spirit; because He speaks with the same voice and the same words you hear when you read your Bible. And, the Holy Spirit never contradicts the written Word of God. When you allow God to speak to you through your Bible, you give the Holy Spirit something to work with. Because the Holy Spirit will bring back to your remembrance all the things you've heard through the Word (John 14:26).

Without the Holy Spirit telling you what to say, the words you speak are not worth much. We have to remember that our life is not all about us; it's all about God. When your

mind is on you and your problems, you'll crumble under the pressure of the devil. If you'll put your attention on what God needs you to do and say, you'll get stronger. Your personal problems will be swallowed up in fulfilling your calling.

Remember, God created you and your purpose before the foundation of the world. He has assigned you a place that perfectly mirrors your calling, gifts, and anointings. That place is where you will be the happiest, most prosperous, and most graced, and it is the place where you will bear the most fruit and get the best results. You were born to be in that place and that's where God is directing you!

When we are in our place and operating in our grace, suddenly things will work out. When we are busy doing the things God told us to do and saying what God told us to say, we will discover the key to all success. Stop trying to change your life and start changing your world by doing and saying what God wants. Then as you change your world, your life will automatically change.

## Day 31

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### *Your Harvest Has Been Waiting On You*

As I mentioned previously, it's not God's fault that we are not enjoying our blessing, our healing and our harvest. God has done everything He's going to do. Second Peter 1:3 says, "*His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness.*" "*Has given*" is past tense. He has already done it! God saw the end from the beginning and created a plan for your life. And, everything you need to fulfill the plan has already been placed on the earth by Him.

You may have thought that you've been waiting on your harvest, but the truth is, *your harvest has been waiting on you*. We are the deciding factor as to whether we enjoy it or not. The responsibility for a harvest has never been on God; it has always been on us.

So, if God has a harvest and blessing waiting for us, what's the trigger that releases the flow? Someone might say, "Quick! Show me where the button is so I can push it!" Sorry, God doesn't hand out remote controls or smartphone apps when people become believers. But – it is truly that simple!

When you accepted Jesus as your Savior, how long did it take to get saved? Was it through a long process of waiting, hoping and pleading? No, it happened instantly! In a moment, your spirit was recreated and you were translated out of the kingdom of darkness and into the Kingdom of God (Colossians 1:13). All that happened instantly, and it happened when you believed or released your faith (Ephesians 2:8).

If that's how we received the promise of salvation, the greatest promise anyone can receive, then that's how we are going to receive every other promise of God – by faith! Colossians 2:6 says, “*As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him.*” We are supposed to walk by faith and use our faith to enjoy everything God has already given to us.

James 2:17-22 teaches us that *faith without works is dead*. That means our faith is incomplete unless it has works. If we are going to live and operate by faith, and receive the promises of God by faith, then we need to make sure we have *com-plete* faith – not dead faith. In the context of this passage, Abraham completed his faith by offering something precious to God – his son Isaac. By doing this, Abraham proved he had complete faith! Isaac became the seed Abraham offered. God always looks at your seed, or giving, to measure your faith.

Your harvest, blessing, and breakthrough have been waiting on you to plant the *right seed*. Sowing the right seed is the way to access all things. That's how the Father received a family of sons and daughters. He planted the right Seed – *Jesus!* Ask the Lord to direct your giving and show you what seeds to sow to complete your faith and access all His promises, and your harvest!


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
